



Bill Ellwood

Bill Ellwood was an outstanding left arm orthodox spinner who started playing cricket in 1920 with Talgarno in the Tallangatta and District Cricket Association and followed them to the Albury and Border First Grade in 1928-29.

Bill was an old timer who valued the team more than anything else. Whilst he generally batted first drop, he did state that one of his biggest disappointments in cricket was that he did not make a hundred.

Some of Bill's highlights are:

- 9 for 32 against Border
- 8 for 18 against Diggers
- 4 for 6 against Wodonga (Inc a Hatrick)
- 7 for 28 and 6 for 18 against Hume Weir
- 7 for 23 and 4 for 10 against Diggers
- 7 for 44 and 3 for 8 against Murray Semi Final
- 8 for 16 and 6 for 17 against Devonia Grand Final
- 39 Wickets in one week for Albury at Country Week
- 96 Not Out against Yackandandah

According to Bill his best bowling figures were 3 for 61 against NSW in 1933.

His three wickets in order were:
