



Peter Duck

Peter Duck was an aggressive opening/top order batsman and exceptionally skilled gloveman. He was renowned as a shrewd captain who often excelled on the big stage.

Peter played 1st grade cricket for St Patrick's and Tower Cricket clubs. In a career spanning from 1973 to 2000, he scored 12 centuries and 19 half centuries, including at least one century in each season from the 1980-81 to 1987-88. As a keeper, he took a total of 195 catches and 39 stumping's.

Some of Peter's cricketing highlights include:

- 173 against East Albury
- 125 against SS&A
- 134 against Wodonga
- 127 against Eskdale
- 101 against North Albury
- 151 against Uncle Ben's in the 1984-85 Grand Final
- 121 against Lavington in the 1993-94 Grand Final

Peter captained Tower Cricket Club to successive premierships in the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons.

Peter represented the ABCA on a number of occasions, including Country Week, the O'Farrell Cup and the Toohey's Cup. He played against the touring Western Australian State Team and in December 1983, opened the batting for Southern Riverina against the touring Pakistani side at Griffith.

Peter has also acted in the roles of President and Secretary of the St Patrick's Cricket Club and was awarded life membership of St Patrick's Cricket Club in 2002.
