



Tony Scammell

Tony started his career as a 13-year-old in the 1957-58 season for the Thurgoona Cricket Club. He played senior cricket with his father and uncles as there were no other grades available for him at the time.

Tony contributed to a number of clubs throughout his career. He moved to St Patricks Cricket Club in the 1960-61 season and from there to Albury Colts then SS&A then New City across to Postal United and then finally back to his true home, New City.

Some of Tony's highlights include:

- 117 against North Albury
- 147 against City Colts
- 200 against East Albury
- Represented ABCA at Country Week 1978 and 1979
- Winning the Coulston Scammell Shield 3 Times
- Winning the Kingsgrove under 17 State Carnival with Riverina side

Between 1995 and 2007 Tony completed level 1 and 2 coaching courses and soon became involved with the Murray Cricket Council as Director of Coaching.

Tony also became coach of the Riverina Bradman Cup Squad at NSW state level and was awarded a Distinguished Service Award for his services to Riverina Cricket.

He has been an integral part of cricket in the Albury Wodonga area for the past 59 years and is still coaching juniors at New City Cricket Club, a role he has filled since its re-formation 10 years ago.

Tony achieved the rare feat of playing competition cricket in the same side as both his son and his grandson.
